





Careers Talk Assemblies

Thank you for explaining your job role and organisation to our young people.

Your experiences are invaluable to bring careers to life and provide a first-hand account of the world of work.

The assembly will involve:

- A short presentation providing information about what your organisation does
- Details of your job role (including your pathway to that job e.g. university, apprenticeship)
- Other job roles within your organisation
- The skills required e.g. team work, communication
- How your job role links to curriculum subjects e.g. literacy, science, maths
- A day in the life of one of your job roles
- Challenging stereotypes through discussion and questioning
- An opportunity for students to ask questions.
- Timings range from 15 30 minutes.

The school will provide:

- Details of the timings, date, and duration
- The number of students that will be attending
- The year group and age of the students
- A named contact
- Context around the visit e.g., have they been learning about the sector in lessons? Does the assembly link to curriculum activities?
- Any questions that the children have asked prior to the visit.

How to prepare:

- Plan your key messages
- Don't be afraid to use technical terms (the stranger sounding the better!). Just make sure these are explained
- Use images, props, or relevant uniform.
- Think about how you will answer any unexpected or personal questions e.g., how much do you earn?

Most importantly

- Share your interest and enthusiasm for your organisation and industry.
- Enjoy the opportunity to share your experiences.
- Encourage others to do the same!

Finally

- Share your invaluable feedback with the school as to how you found the experience. This will support the school to improve their careers programme.
